The Story Behind the Pictures: "The Real Football" In this PhotoMail, as the 2014 World Cup reaches its closing stages, a look at 'The Real Football', as played by Africa's

children - a retrospective of an exhibition called "The Beautiful African Game". This was first exhibited at the time of the previous World Cup in South Africa in June 2010. Throughout Africa, in every remote village, in every poor township, there are children playing football. Often they do not have

a football pitch; they do not have football boots; and they don't even have a ball. But such is their passion for the game that


they still play - they clear a playing area, erect makeshift goals, play without shoes, and use a home-made ball made from waste plastic bags and strips of rubber. The photography sought to show how the real football in Africa starts - with the passion, skills and dreams of young children all over the continent, in those poor townships and villages. The photographs were made at a remote village called "Mubuyu

Village" ('Baobab Village') in Southern Zambia. The village called it's football team "The Mubuyu Warriors". The photography was done using film and a medium format panoramic landscape camera. The exhibition was supported and hosted by the French Government through its educational & cultural organisation, Alliance

Française and its first showing was seen by over 1000 visitors in Lusaka, Zambia. The work was the subject of some controversy and comment after one local journalist and his newspaper reported that it showed a "colonialist view" of Africa - poor children playing barefoot, without a 'real' ball and without 'proper' football strips.




