## Life in the Shadows 1: CLOUD'S STORY Almost every aspect of the daily life of African people with albinism is dictated by their rare and

unfortunate condition - a quirk of genetics which means they lack normal pigmentation in their hair, skin and eyes. It makes for a life which most of us would find agonizing, even unbearable. Most media coverage of Africans with albinism is centred on the news-grabbing extremes of their physical abuse, mutilation and even murder. Such coverage makes little mention of the adversities

they face every day - including stigma & extreme discrimination, isolation & exclusion, serious health

& vision problems, and public ridicule. And all this every day, day-in, day-out. So this story, from the new reportage project 'Life in the Shadows: Albinism in Africa', is about the ordinary: the ordinary daily story of African people with albinism, a story that few of us know about.

Accompanying the exhibition photographs are the subjects' own stories of their daily lives, in their own words.

In this PhotoMail, the story of a young African boy with albinism and his determination to go to school, against all odds. His name is Cloud and he features in the recently launched online exhibition 'Life in the Shadows: Albinism in Africa' (see
