THE KAFUE STORY: Zambia's Lifeline River - Part 3

In this PhotoMail, the final Part 3 of the life story of Zambia's most important River - the Kafue River. "I wished I could have photographed a scene so seldom beheld,


and which is destined ... to pass away from Earth." David Livingstone, 1855 Zambia's namesake river is of course the Zambezi River – but it is the Zambezi's largest tributary, the Kafue River,

that is by far the most important in socio-economic terms. To get some idea of the immense importance of the Kafue River, we continue on our trip into the river's lower reaches and to its end, where we meet a famous and far-seeing gentleman:



and dramatic Kafue Gorge. Here it changes character again as it drops some 550m in a distance of only 60

kilometres. It fills reservoirs for two of Zambia's most important hydro-power generation installations. In these lower reaches, the Kafie's flow rate amounts to over 320 cu.m. per second. N ROBINSON / WILDFOTO




The Kafue River ends its long 1600km journey at its confluence with the Zambezi River. The confluence is located some 20km north-east of the Zambia-Zimbabwe border town of Chirundu, in the Lower Zambezi Valley. The Kafue River discharges over 10 cu.km. of water per year into the Zambezi.






